

CARIBOU COUNTY IDAHO
RESOLUTION NUMBER 05-02

WHERE AS Caribou County has utilized the Incident Command System [ICS] as the means to management emergencies in the County, and

WHERE AS the U. S. Department of Homeland Security has developed a comprehensive nationwide framework for incident management that will enable responder's at all levels to work together more effectively to manage incidents no matter what the case, size or complexity, called National Incident Management System [NIMS], and

WHERE AS Homeland Security Presidential Directive-5 establishes the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and its Incident Command System component as the National standard for emergency management within and across jurisdictional boundaries and emergency response disciplines, and

WHERE AS it is the intent of the Department of Homeland Security and Homeland Security Presidential Directive-5 that a nation-wide standardized emergency management model will enhance response capabilities, facilitate more efficient and timely resolution of emergencies and significant events, and provide for a standardized methodology of interaction between emergency management, response and governmental agencies, and


WHERE AS the U. S. Department of Homeland Security has established a requirement for all government and emergency entities to adopt the National Incident Management System [NIMS], and specifically the Incident Command System component as a local, regional and State Standard of incident management, and

WHERE AS the State of Idaho has adopted, promotes and encourages the use of the Incident Command System as a standard practice of managing emergencies in Idaho,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that Caribou County Board of Commissioners by a unanimous vote do hereby adopt the National Incident Management System [NIMS], and it's Incident Command System component as the official methodology for managing emergencies in Caribou County.


